Farm also grows watermelons and summer squash.

**Distribution of Product**  
Riverdog Farm's marketing outlets include wholesale distribution in San Francisco, farmers' marketing in the East Bay, restaurants and retail throughout the Sacramento and bay areas, and their Community Supported Agriculture program of weekly veggie deliveries is available locally via on-farm pick-up.
